- Prepare final report to document findings





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Temporary Terminal Site Abandoned Ships




Shew Panorama, 1853

- **Ship B** abandoned, roofed over and used for storage in 1853; by 1857 it had been removed or dismantled and covered by fill
- Ship D appears in 1852-1853 photos; no evidence of remains found during 1990 borings; Temporary Terminal construction will not disturb soil to depth below fill
- Ship remains potentially buried under 10-18 ft. of historic fill






Temporary Terminal Site Post-quake Rebuilding

Temporary Terminal Site Previous Disturbance

- Transbay Viaduct
- Footings for SF-480
- Soil Bores
- Buildings





Temporary Terminal Site Proposed Testing Program

- 5 test trenches (each 3 ft. wide, 4 ft. deep)
- Intact archaeological deposits limited by previous disturbance
- Testing limited to areas of proposed ground disturbance for current project
- Testing designed to identify archaeological deposits that are potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP
